Enrichment Opportunities:

There are a number of trips which students have the opportunity to attend, these include revision workshops and Economics lectures in Central London.

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What I will learn on this course: Economics is an exciting subject. It's multi-faceted nature allows us to explore a huge range of issues affecting our everyday life and our future. We study why firms make the choices they do and how consumers react. We question the objectives of our country's government and its policies, like tackling unemployment or reducing the gap between rich and poor. We challenge our position in the global economy and discuss how the UK interacts with other countries around the world.

Assessment and Examination: The assessment will be based on 3 papers which will draw on themes from across the units. The weighting between the papers will be 35%, 35%, 30%.

Entry Requirements: Six GCSEs at grade C or above including minimum grade B in both Maths and English Language GCSE. Also, if you have studied GCSE Economics you must have achieved a B grade.
